

## DISCIPLE'S PEN

What is grace? Why is it such a big focus for us as Christ followers?

Ephesians 2:8-9 ESV speaks of grace this way *"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."* A gift from God, meaning something He wanted to give to us that we did not earn. This is such an important part of what we believe. This also means we should live as if we believe this to be true. Christ has bought and paid for our salvation as the greatest grace He could give us. We must live as though we are the only messengers of this great news, and as if this is the only true gift we have ever received. We know how excited we can get when a gift from someone touches our hearts so deeply, we can't help but talk about the gift and the gift giver with that same level excitement. We tell others how amazingly kind and generous the gift giver is. As John 1:16 NIV says, *"Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given."* The abundant grace and love of Jesus Christ.



Titus 2:11-14 NLT says *"For the grace of God has been revealed, bringing salvation to all people. And we are instructed to turn from godless living and sinful pleasures. We should live in this evil world with wisdom, righteousness, and devotion to God, while we look forward with hope to that wonderful day when the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, will be revealed. He gave his life to free us from every kind of sin, to cleanse us, and to make us his very own people, totally"*

***committed to doing good deeds.*** In this life God calls us to live into this truth, which must include showing how what Christ did has changed us. We must live as the blessed people we are. Through Christ we have a sanctified existence, which will forever be protected by Him. John 10:7-10 shows how Jesus describes Himself and what He is offering our lives: *"So, Jesus said to them again, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. All who came before Me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not hear them. I am the door; if anyone enters through Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."*

Verses from Ephesians 3:20 - *Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us* - and 1 Corinthians 2:9 - *No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love him* - speak of this abundant life as something we can't imagine with our own minds. It may be a mystery to us, but it is guaranteed to fill us.

It is hard to see this abundant life that Christ has promised we can have, especially in this culture of comparison that we live in. We can get tripped up by our thoughts of superiority or inferiority. Both have us missing what Christ has really done for us. My hope is that this year's focus on abundant grace will bring us closer to trusting that the gift has been given to us and that it should lead how we live as Christians.
