PASTOR'S PEN- The gift of...



After serving in a pastoral role for several years (15+) here at DMC, I felt the need for a break, especially in light of the pandemic and our recent move to Hellertown. My goals focused on slowing down, exploring what God is doing in our new community and how God might be leading me to be a part of bringing the kingdom. I needed time to listen and seek God's guidance for my work, while at the same time being refreshed in my spirit and body.

Tuesdays and Fridays were my "sabbatical days" while I continued my pastoral work at Dock Woods Community the other days of the week. On Tuesdays, I chose to "fast" from driving, choosing instead to walk wherever I needed to go. I never took the same path, but the Holy Spirit led me all over town, where I met people in stores, at the library, the caretaker at the Catholic Church, on the rail trail, etc. I tried the public transit system and rode the bus to Bethlehem and noticed the waiting time needed to travel this way. It highlighted the fast pace of our society and the privilege I have of having a car to drive where and when I want to go.

I also took the opportunity to visit other churches for Sunday worship. I worshiped in various settings (urban and suburban) with different denominations (charismatic, evangelical, large and small), but all Christ-centered. It really gave me a new appreciation for the many expressions of faithful witness to the gospel. Visiting all these churches also gave me a great appreciation for our own congregation, where I have trusted relationships and can be encouraged in my walk with Jesus.

I did also leave time for fun in my sabbatical. I took guitar lessons at a local music store and am enjoying this hobby that gives me great joy and delight. I purposely invited the women in my neighborhood to a spring tea to build connections with them. Wow, was that fun, laughing together and hearing their stories!

Jesus sent his disciples out two by two to the villages to proclaim and demonstrate the kingdom of God. This idea became more clear to me as I spent time walking, worshiping and listening during my sabbatical. God wants us to speak about his love and demonstrate it. In the Lord's prayer we pray, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." When we pray that, we become part of the answer to that prayer through our words and actions.

To that end, I would like to pray with you in your home and neighborhood to invite God to show you how his kingdom is coming where you live. How are you a part of that as you proclaim and demonstrate God's love? Please reach out to me if you want to pray together. I am available on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays to spend an hour or so with you where you live, either inside or outside prayer walking if you like.

As we oversee the Compassion Fund, we are grateful for God's leading and the generosity of the congregation to provide financial support for various needs.


We closed with prayer for several individuals and families in our congregation. Our next meeting is on Tuesday, May 10, at 7:00 pm.
